



Khairul Islam Higher Education Society, Mumbai



#### **Pandemic Overview on Online Education**

The Covid Pandemic has taken a great toll on the education system and on all the stakeholders especially the students. Almost for two precious years, the students have been deprived of physical interaction with schools and colleges. These two years have made them slaves of the 'mobile' phone. Excessive exposure to the net has made them addict to the media. To imagine the outcome because of absence of the guidance of teachers/parents is scary. With no hands on training and only theoretical inputs (that too online) the students, who have passed their exams and especially their graduations, will find it difficult to get foothold in the market

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There is a large numbers of students who because of the problem of not having appropriate devices and no consistent network have lost umpteen hours of online education. Students from rural and semi urban areas are the major sufferers. Similarly poverty has always been a hurdle in acquiring education and with online mode of education the students from these strata have been literally thrown out of reach.

In conclusion, we have to agree that on one hand some students and institutions may have gained technically but on the other hand, in general, the student community and the education sector has eroded their values which will be difficult to fill in the years to come. But as it is said that every coin has two sides, we should try to turn the coin and see the brighter side of the situation. So, in spite of all odds, we should take it as a challenge or even opportunity to come out with new ideas, techniques and strategies.

For example, the lock down has provided ample time and this free time can be used to read, learn and train ourselves. We can learn soft skills, new languages give flight to our fantasy by writing stories and poems; start painting, explore our hobbies and latent talent and so on, the sky is the limit.

A case study of Maharashtra College of Arts, Science and Commerce.

Maharashtra College runs Maharashtra College Employees Co-operative Credit
Society Ltd. (MCECCSL) and Al-Falah Interest Free Credit Society.

Maharashtra College Employees Co-operative Credit Society Ltd. (MCECCSL) was started in the year 1971 with registration under Co-operative Credit Society Ltd. (BOM/RSR/552/1971 dated 23/3/1971) for the in-service employees (Teaching and Non-Teaching staff) of Maharashtra College. The objective of MCECCSL is to provide financial assistance to all the in-service employees of Maharashtra College in financial constraints.

From the beginning, the society MCECCSL was interest based. The members were charged interest @ 6% of the loan amount. However in the year 2018, by a unanimous resolution passed by all the members, the charging of interest was waived and the system of minimum processing fees charging was introduced. As a result of this, now processing fees of only 0.5% is charged. This resulted into a big benefit to all the members.

The newly appointed employees are encouraged to become a member of the society to get the financial assistance. An average monthly contribution is Rs.1500/- pm from each member which is deducted from their pay. Loan amount Rs. 20,000 to Rs. 3,00,000/- can be sanctioned with loan processing fee 0.5% of loan amount. EMI are calculated on maximum of 84 months (7 years term loan) and prepayment facility also extended.

Al-Falah Interest Free Credit Society started in the year 2013. The members are teachers from Junior and Senior College. The objective of Al-Falah Interest Free Credit Society is to provide financial assistance at 0% interest rate to the teachers in financial need. Average monthly contribution starts with Rs.2,000/-pm. Teacher taking loan has to pay off entire loan amount in 30 interest free monthly installment.







Multidisciplinary E-National Conference on 'Tracing the Impact of Covid-19 Pandemic on Social, Economic, Political, and Psychological Conditions in India: Challenges for 21st Century'

Maharashtra College of Arts, Science and Commerce & Dr. Rafiq Zakaria Centre for Post-Graduate Studies and Research, Mumbai, organised a multidisciplinary E-National Conference on 'Tracing the Impact of Covid-19 Pandemic on Social, Economic, Political and Psychological Conditions in India: Challenges for 21st Century' on 5th April, 2021. The conference which was actually conceptualised by Social Science Departments of the college began by recitation of verses from the Quran. Prof Mujahid Khan of Department of Arabic and Islamic Studies recited the verses and also narrated its translation in English. Prof Asema Siddiqui of Department of Economics who was hosting the conference along with Prof Misbah Karbhari of the same department, invited Prof M. Z. Shahid of Department of Political Science and also the Convenor of the conference to talk about the objective and concept of the conference.

While talking about the objective and concept of the conference, Prof Shahid informed the virtual audience that the preliminary discussion about the e-national conference began in January, 2021. The idea of several disciplines of social sciences coming together to organise the conference helped in understanding the multi-dimensional nature of the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on human life. He also talked about the dominance of the word 'e'

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with increasing digitisation of the formal work processes. It is acquiring more and more relevance with the social distancing being practised as a necessary norm in the life of the human population. The reality of being virtual has been gaining acceptance world-wide. He further pointed out that being skilled at technology was almost the necessity of life today.

While elaborating on the rationale behind the theme for the conference, Prof Shahid said that the Coronavirus better known as Covid-19 has created the first global civil emergency of the 21st century. It has caused unprecedented devastation, loss of human life and economic disruption worldwide. The far-reaching impact of the disease on social, economic, political, and psychological conditions in India is still being assessed. With the surge and resurge of infections in various parts of India, newer dimensions of the disease are emerging, and stories of frustration and desolation are being retold with greater anguish.

He further said that the sudden lockdown imposed to combat the disease in India had an impact on all facets of life. It has had significant psychological and social effects on the population, especially the children, college students, working women and health workers. The imposition of social distancing and strict security measures adopted to contain the virus, have affected the relationship among people and their perception of empathy toward others. The involuntary separation from loved ones, loss of freedom, uncertainty about health conditions and losing one's sources of livelihood have created a feeling of helplessness. The large-scale disruption to economic activities in India has adversely affected almost all the sectors of national economy. It has also given enough reason to the government to deny various freedoms to people and legitimise further an authoritative administration and establish a police state with greater ferocity.

Prof Shahid, while talking about the objective of the conference further said that their endeavour, through the e-conference, is to understand and assess the impact of Covid-19 on social, economic, political and psychological conditions in India. The broader objective of the conference is to gauge the effects and analyse the various measures adopted by the government to deal with the pandemic. In such a situation an e-platform gives the citizenry an additional opportunity to ask questions to those in power. Looking at the enormity of the

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sufferings caused to the people during the lockdown one is justifiably tempted to ask if it could have been done differently to minimise the damage to the economy and lessen the anguish caused to the people at large. Despite the odds, this is the time to make efforts to deal with the crisis and learn from the sufferings of the people. This is also the time to determine the possible challenges for this century and prepare ourselves to face and confront the consequences.

Principal Dr. Sirajuddin Chougle in his opening remarks emphasised the need to have this kind of academic interactions to clarify our own perception with regard to such pandemic. Dr. Chougle who in fact encouraged the members of the organising committee to organise the conference was quite optimistic about such intellectual exercises. He chose to thanks the key-note speaker and other eminent guests who had joined on line to be part of the conference since morning. Dr Chougle also spoke about the various achievements of Maharashtra College during last five years and how the college has earned a name for itself.

Dr. Hanif Lakdawala, founder Director, Sanchetana Community Health and Research Centre, Ahmedabad, Gujarat, invited as a key-note speaker began his talk with tracing the history of such pandemics during the last century and how the world faced the consequences and finally dealt with it successfully. He narrated with anguish the sufferings of the people in the country due to sudden lockdown and how the migrant workers were left to fend for themselves. He talked about various incidents within Ahmedabad during the period and how at Sanchetana they could play a positive role. Dr. Lakdawala also pointed out the futility of the various governmental measures. He also talked about how discrimination is being institutionalised in health care system and people are being left to look for their own solution. Towards the end of the inaugural session, Dr. Karen Miranda, HOD, department of Sociology, thanked the guests.

The inaugural programme was followed by the technical sessions which were virtually categorised as R-1 and R-2 to better facilitate the presentation of research papers received at the conference. The technical session R-1 was chaired by Dr. Gautam Gawli, Professor and Director, Amity Institute of Behavioural and Allied Sciences, Mumbai, and moderated by

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Dr. Liyaqat Khan, Professor, Department of Civics and Politics, University of Mumbai. The technical session R-1 which was hosted by Professor Asema Siddiqui, had ten participants who presented their research papers.

The technical session R-2 which was digitally designed to run parallel to R-1, was chaired by Dr. Anita Rath, Professor, School of Development Studies, Tata Institute of Social Science (TISS), Mumbai, and moderated by Dr. Balaji N. Kendre, Professor & Head, Department of Sociology, University of Mumbai. The technical session R-2 which was hosted by Prof Misbah Karbhari, had 13 participants who presented their research papers.

The valedictory session which was held in the afternoon, began with expert comments and observations from the chairpersons and the moderators who had keenly listened to all the research presentations. The chairpersons and moderators of both R-1 and R-2 were generous in their appreciation for the researchers who had invested so much time energy in fact finding and had managed to present a good analysis from the data they had gathered. The chairpersons and the moderators also chose to offer suggestions and points to be cautiously adhered to while undertaking academic research. In the absence of Dr. Anita Rath in the valedictory session, her observations were read by Dr. Rakhshandah Hani, HOD, Department of Economics and Coordinator of the conference.

The observations on research papers presented at the conference was followed by talks by resource persons especially invited at the virtual conference. Shri Yogesh Mishra, Head, Research Unit, PRAJA, Mumbai, presented a very comprehensive report on 'Impact of Covid-19 in Mumbai' which was prepared after a field research by the PRAJA team. Shri Mishra in his lucid presentation which was full of data and information collected at the grassroot level pointed out how the measures to contain the virus have been disastrous for the small businesses and the informal sector. He also highlighted the severity of impact of Covid-19 on the life of the urban poor and those who were dependent on daily income from various sources.

Adv. Irfan Engineer, Director, Centre for Study of Society and Secularism (CSSS), Mumbai, in his analytical talk on 'Scapegoating During Coivd-19 Pandemic in India' highlighted how Muslims in general and 'Tablighi Jamat'

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in particular were blamed with assistance from few media houses for spreading the virus in India. Even in a pandemic like situation attempts were made to communalise the disaster and spread hatred against a particular community. He further said that the tendency to divert the attention from one's own failure and look for a scapegoat is socially disruptive and violative of human rights. It is dangerous for society as it divides the society on communal lines and leads to discriminatory practices even by health workers and hospitals against the community who is declared by media as so called 'super-spreader'. Adv. Irfan Engineer also talked about the report of the CSSS on the topic and highlighted its findings. He pointed out the there is a need for secular forces to unite and prevent such disruptions in future and blame-game against a community without any authentic data and information.

Adv. Irfan Engineer's presentation was followed by the valedictory speech by Dr. Amar Jesani, former, Chief Executive, CEHAT, and the Editor, Indian Journal of Medical Forum for Medical Ethics'. Dr. Jesani, in a very analytical and insightful narrative, questioned various terminologies used in the process of containing the Covid-19. He, for instance, stated that instead of talking about 'physical distancing' the government has imposed 'social distancing' which conveys a different connotation and through this a new form of untouchability is being practised in society. Dr. Jesani said that the fight against the pandemic was important but not by creating a social environment where people start distrusting each other. The attempt to restrict our civil and political rights are being justified on scientific grounds. Instead of bringing about improvement in our health care system people are being locked-down in dictatorial manner. While agreeing that some restrictions are required to contain the virus, it cannot be misused to violate the human rights of the citizens. The decision to impose restrictions must be based on scientific consultation and justified grounds. The idea of curtailing democratic rights to fight the pandemic is undesirable. He also stated that despite the fact that vaccines were urgently needed in India, 60 % of the vaccines had been exported which would lead to shortages in India very soon.

The valedictory session was followed by vote of thanks by Vice Principal Dr. Abdul Majid Ansari who thanked all the guests, delegates from other colleges and the members of the organising committee. The programme ended with the National Anthem.

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### An Online Interaction With Arts Ex Students.

On Monday 19th July at 8:30 AM, the Department of Sociology of Maharashtra College had organized an online interaction with ARTS EX students so to guide the current as well as passing students of TYBA. It was title

They show on television that women who sport black clothing, wacky hairdo, tattoos and pull off crazy stunts are badass, but do they know that a woman dressed in a simple cotton dhoti can be a total badass in real life? Mother Teresa was one of those women and Padma Shri Sudha Murthy is yet another name that goes on that list. Sudha Murthy Is the Kind Of Role Model we women need today. She is an inspiration to many, with the multiple roles she has played over the years of an engineer, author, philanthropist, homemaker and many more. She was way ahead of her time and very

confident. She, later on, became the backbone of Infosys, co-founded by her husband Narayan Murthy. Sudha is a bestselling writer and has sold over 1.5 million books. Not only that, she has authored several fictional novels in Kannada and English. She is actively involved in social work in the field of education, women empowerment, poverty alleviation, healthcare, public hygiene, art and culture among others and 20 days of every month, she visits rural areas as part of Infosys Foundation relief work.

Sudha Murthy's life story is an ideal for millions and an inspiration for trillions. Sudha Murthy hails from a middle-class family. She was born in Shiggaon in Northern Karnataka on 19th August 1950. Her father R.H Kulkarni was a doctor cum Professor and her mother; Vimla Kulkarni was a school teacher. Though she was born in a middle-class family, her family was extremely studies-oriented. This was the reason Sudha, despite being a girl child, pursued Engineering when getting an education for a girl was even a matter of disbelief. In the 1960s, Sudha was the first woman to enroll in engineering when it was considered a male domain. It was such a 'men' thing then that there did not even exist a women's toilet in the campus. Sudha

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Murthy never focused on the things which harassed her when she was the only student among 150 students in engineering, the boys spilled the ink on her chair and used to throw paper airplanes at her but Sudha, non-defeated with a resolved mind focused on her studies. She knew to build a building from the stones thrown at her. Everyone knew her marks before the exam results were announced and her scores were the first thing up on the wall but Sudha was unfazed because she had a bigger goal in place.

She was the first female engineer in TELCO (probably in India as well): While applying for the position at TELCO, she found a footnote that said 'female candidates need not apply', that she did not appreciate and wrote to JRD Tata raising the issue of "men only" gender bias at TELCO, asking him how a prime and innovative house like the Tatas, "which always thought ahead of time, could put such a restriction." To her surprise, she was granted a special interview with a paid round trip and was hired on spot. She then joined India's largest auto manufacturer TATA as a Development Engineer and worked in various locations like Mumbai, Pune, and Jamshedpur.

Sudha Murthy And Narayan Murthy: Two Sides Of A Coin. It would be an injustice not to talk about N.R Narayan Murthy with Sudha Murthy. Narayan Murthy and Sudha Murthy are like two sides of a coin according to me. Both of them are contrary yet complementary and supplementary to each other. In 1978, Murthy and Sudha Murthy tied the knot. The total cost of the wedding ceremony was Rs 800 which both the families shared equally. This is something that amazed me and so wanted to highlight in my article.

Sudha Murthy received Padma Shri for her contribution to the economy and social welfare. Sudha Murthy has seen things differently. She is the one who followed a vision, not a path. When others think how to change things, she was determined to take steps to change things. It is her personality and ambition that attracts all those around her and those who look up to her. 
